# April 15, 2019

The Board of Ellsworth County Commissioners convened this 15<sup>th</sup> day of April 2019 at the Ellsworth County Courthouse.

### **OPENING BUSINESS:**

Chairman Dlabal called the meeting to order at 9:00 a.m.

Commissioner Rush moved to approve the Agenda. Commissioner Rolfs seconded the motion. Motion carried 3-0.

Commissioner Rush moved to approve the Minutes for April 8, 2019. Commissioner Dlabal seconded the motion. Motion carried 3-0.

#### **PUBLIC FORUM:**

**Terry Kueser, Central Kansas Community Corrections Advisory Board Member,** was in attendance but did not wish to address the Commissioners.

### **APPOINTMENTS:**

Amy Boxberger & Marissa Woodmansee, representing Central Kansas Community Corrections (CKCC), discussed prevention dollars they need for intake and investigation on drug and alcohol offenders. The State requires a success rate of 75% for adult and child offenders, to receive complete funding. The CKCC fell short by 1% in 2018, so their budget was cut for 2019. They are applying for a state block grant to have the monies needed for offender evaluations. Ms. Boxberger presented the 2020 Comprehensive Plan for approval. Commissioner Rush moved to approve the 2020 Comprehensive Plan for CKCC as presented, the Behavior Grant for drug and alcohol evaluation and re-appointing Terry Kueser for a 3 year term to the CKCC advisory board. Commissioner Rolfs seconded the motion. Motion carried 3-0.

**Rick Nondorf, Road & Bridge Supervisor,** asked Commissioner Rolfs to sign a supplement for the State of Kansas from April 1, 2019, since Rolfs left the Commissioner Meeting early that day. Commissioners Rolfs asked if the Road & Bridge Dept. could help Lorraine City with their
